Day 13: Okayama, Naoshima, Okayama A truly special experience awaits today with a full day on the remarkable Naoshima Island. You'll travel to Uno Port for your ferry to the island. Commonly known as Art Island, Naoshima Island is peppered with captivating galleries and outdoor art pieces. The exploration begins at Chichu Art Museum, a unique museum built into the hillside overlooking the coastline. Designed by Ando Tadao, the building lies

mostly underground and relies only on natural light to illuminate each work, allowing you to admire its permanent Claude Monet paintings in diffused daylight. Following lunch at a local restaurant, you'll visit the Benesse House Museum, which was also designed by Tadao. Later, enjoy the Art House Project, which features an abandoned temple and shrine along with a collection of abandoned houses and workshops converted into art installations and galleries by artists and architects from across the world. Wander between and inside each converted space and admire the diverse art installations. Return to Okayama and be transferred to your accommodation, enjoying dinner tonight at your hotel. BLD

Day 14: Okayama, Hiroshima This morning, visit the beautiful and spacious Korakuen Garden, a member of the Three Great Gardens of Japan. Afterwards, board a bullet train for a first-class ride to Hiroshima. Here you'll visit the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park, which lies at ground zero of the devastating atomic bomb which dropped on the city in August 1945. A sacred island and holy place of Shintoism, Miyajima is home to the World Heritage-listed Itsukushima Shrine, which is famous for its partially submerged "floating" torii gate. After strolling around the island, be transferred back to your hotel and enjoy Hiroshima's charm at your leisure. **BL**

Day 16: Hiroshima, Fukuoka After breakfast, board a first-class bullet train to Fukuoka, where you'll have free time for lunch before a visit to Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine. Electricity is 110V throughout Japan and 220V in South Korea. A plug adaptor is necessary if you plan to bring items from home.

Allergies

If you have a food allergy or another condition that needs to be managed on tour, please advise your booking agent as soon as possible, as most suppliers require advance notice to accommodate this. In some cases you might be asked to fill out a form or waiver.

Audio Guides

Each guest will have an audio headset. While touring, these lightweight headsets allow you to hear every word of your guide's commentary.



Bedding Configuration

Double beds are on a request basis for hotels in Japan and cannot be guaranteed.

Beverages

During land journeys, complimentary water and tea are offered during meals. Complimentary alcoholic beverages may also be included with some dinners.

Climate

Japan and South Korea's weather varies greatly between seasons – expect hot and humid weather during the summer, and cold winters with the possibility of snow in some locations. 

If a problem occurs during your holiday you should, in your own interests, advise your tour director so that steps can be taken to resolve the matter. If you remain dissatisfied, any complaint must be made in writing to APT within 30 days.

Luggage Limits

Lugage Limits

Each passenger is entitled to take one piece of luggage that does not exceed 160cm (63 inches), or weigh more than 23kg (50 pounds). Dimensions for checked baggage are calculated by adding together the width, height and depth of the piece of baggage. An extra charge will be imposed to cover porterage handling of any additional luggage. Your tour director will advise you of the exact additional charge.

Some holiday packages may have restricted luggage limits, please refer to Specific Terms & Conditions under relevant destination for more information.

A \$1,000 security deposit per person, per holiday package for all tours is required within seven days of booking confirmation. Deposit requirements may vary when booking a special offer. Final payment of the balance of your holiday package price is due 100 days prior to departure unless stated in the terms of a special offer. APT reserves the right to cancel any ticket or booking or, refuse to honour any price or carry any passenger where any payment has not been received by APT within the specified time. All fares and charges are in Australian currency. Payment in full is required at time of booking for reservations made less than 100 days before departure from Australia or New Zealand. If APT is unable to confirm your reservation, all monies will unable to confirm your reservation, all monies will be refunded.

Travelling with Minors

Children of less than 12 years of age are not permitted on tours and cruises. Minors under 18 years of age must be

accompanied by an adult and share their accommodation with an adult.

Included in Holiday Package Price

As indicated in individual itineraries – all transport, accommodation, airfares (if indicated in individual itinerary), gratuities, airport transfers on the first and last day, sightseeing, specified excursions, meals as Indicated, admissions, port charges, luggage service (one bag) and the services of a Tour Director.
